<b>Type</b>	<b>DUI Trailer Command Post (Category 5)</b>
<b>Description</b>	2003, Ultra Hauler 18' Enclosed, 2 axle Cargo Trailer
<b>Quantity</b>	1
<b>Capabilities</b>	The DUI mobile command trailer can also be utilized for other critical incidents, preplanned large events, searching for missing persons, natural disasters, and community events.
<b>Expected lifespan</b>	The mobile command trailer, 20-year lifespan on chassis and vehicle structure. Upgrades may be needed in 7 years to maintain IT systems.
<b>Manufacturer's description</b>	18' enclosed 2 axle cargo trailer
<b>Purpose and authorized uses</b>	Primarily a DUI Trailer to be used based on DUI checkpoints. Can be utilized under specific circumstances of a given critical incident, large event, natural disaster or community event that is taking place.
<b>Fiscal impact</b>	Annual maintenance cost of approximately \$1,000.00 a year
<b>Legal and procedural rules</b>	It is the policy of the Department to use the DUI mobile command trailer only for official law enforcement purposes, and in accordance with California State law regarding the operation of motor vehicles.
<b>Required training</b>	The driver/operator shall receive training in the safe handling of the trailer, and must have prior experience in pulling a trailer.
<b>Compliance mechanisms</b>	Operational use under the review of the Operation Division Lieutenant, on-duty Watch Commander or appropriate team supervisor and governed under Dinuba Police Department Policy 703-Vehicle Use.
<b>Use Reporting 2023</b>	Used 4 times as a command post for Officers working various city sponsored events.
<b>Summary of Complaints or Concerns 2023</b>	There were no complaints or concerns received.
<b>Internal Audits / Violations 2023</b>	No Violations

<b>Type</b>	<b>37 MM Launchers and Munitions</b> (Category 14)
<b>Description</b>	37 MM Launchers are utilized by department personnel as a less lethal tool to launch kinetic energy projectiles.
<b>Quantity</b>	2 – total 1. Penn Arms L6/L8 37MM Multi-shot Launcher. 1. Penn Arms GL1-40 37 MM Single Shot Launcher.
<b>Capabilities</b>	Both Penn Arms (L6/L8) & (GL1-40) 37MM Launchers are tactical launchers that feature a fixed stock and iron sights. They will fire standard 37mm less lethal munitions.
<b>Expected lifespan</b>	25 Years
<b>Manufacturer's description</b>	Less lethal 37 MM launchers allow for personnel to introduce less lethal munitions from a safe distance. The range of the weapon system helps to maintain space between officers and a suspect reducing the immediacy of the threat which is a principle of De-escalation.
<b>Purpose and authorized uses</b>	To limit the escalation of conflict where employment of lethal force is prohibited or undesirable. Situations for use of the less lethal weapon systems may include, but are not limited to: 1. Self-destructive, dangerous and/or combative individuals. 2. Riot/crowd control and civil unrest incidents. 3. Circumstances where a tactical advantage can be obtained. 4. Potentially vicious animals. 5. Training exercises or approved demonstrations.
<b>Fiscal impact</b>	No cost maintenance; only cost of yearly munitions for training and qualification.
<b>Legal and procedural rules</b>	It is the policy of the Department to utilize the 37 mm only for official law enforcement purposes, and pursuant to State and Federal law, including those regarding the use of force.
<b>Required training</b>	Sworn members utilizing 37 MM less lethal munitions impact rounds are trained in their use by POST certified less lethal instructors.
<b>Compliance mechanisms</b>	Operational use under the review of the On-duty Watch Commander or and governed under Dinuba Police Department Policy 303.9 Kinetic Energy Projectile Guidelines.
<b>Use Reporting 2023</b>	Was not used in 2023
<b>Summary of Complaints or Concerns 2023</b>	There were no complaints or concerns received.
<b>Internal Audits / Violations 2023</b>	No Violations
<b>Intended Acquisition in 2023</b>	1 Penn Arms Launcher, which was approved/ordered in 2022 at a cost of \$1200.00. Delivered in August of 2023.

<b>Type</b>	<b>Specialized Firearms (Rifles) and Ammunition (Category 10)</b>
<b>Description</b>	Guns that are fired from shoulder level, having a long spirally grooved barrel intended to make bullets spin and thereby have greater accuracy over a long distance.
<b>Quantity</b>	33 total 23 - Colt AR-15/M4 Rifles 10 – Sig Sauer MCX Rifles
<b>Capabilities</b>	Precision shooting at greater distances than offered by the issued handgun.
<b>Expected lifespan</b>	15 years
<b>Manufacturer's description</b>	The Colt AR-15/M4 is a lightweight, magazine fed, gas-operated, shoulder fired, and semiautomatic rifle. The Sig Sauer MCX are a lightweight, magazine fed, short-stroke gas-operated piston, shoulder fired, and semiautomatic rifle.
<b>Purpose and authorized uses</b>	To be used as precision weapon to address a threat with more precision and/or greater distances as a handgun, if present and feasible.
<b>Fiscal impact</b>	No cost maintenance; only cost of yearly ammunition for training and qualification.
<b>Legal and procedural rules</b>	It is the policy of the Dinuba Police Department to utilize rifles only for official law enforcement purposes, and pursuant to State and Federal law regarding the use of force.
<b>Required training</b>	Prior to using a rifle, officers must be certified by POST instructors in the operation of the rifle. Additionally, all members that operate any rifle are required to pass a range qualification two times a year.
<b>Compliance mechanisms</b>	Operational use governed by Dinuba Police Department Policy 306-Firearms.
<b>Use Reporting 2023</b>	The rifles were used during range qualifications and training. The rifles were also deployed during patrol operations per policy but were not discharged.
<b>Summary of Complaints or Concerns 2023</b>	There were no complaints or concerns received.
<b>Internal Audits / Violations 2023</b>	No Violations

<b>Type</b>	<b>Flash Bang (Category 12)</b>
<b>Description</b>	A grenade that produces a bright flash and a loud noise.
<b>Quantity</b>	10
<b>Capabilities</b>	A flashbang produces a bright flash and a loud noise so as to stun or disorient people without causing serious injury.
<b>Expected lifespan</b>	25 years
<b>Manufacturer's description</b>	The Non-Reloadable Distraction Device unit incorporates an M201A1 type fuse with hex design gun steel body. This is compact version of the 8933 Low Roll body Distraction Device is the newest version of the first reusable non-bursting canister that limits movement and rolling once deployed. The compact Distraction Device fits safely in your hand and packs all the power of the full size Distraction Device. This is a smaller, lighter device with the same output.
<b>Purpose and authorized uses</b>	To be used by trained personnel during the service of a search warrant as a distractionary device.
<b>Fiscal impact</b>	Zero
<b>Legal and procedural rules</b>	It is the policy of the Department to use flashbangs only for official law enforcement purposes, and in accordance with California State law regarding the operation of motor vehicles.
<b>Required training</b>	Prior to using a flashbang, officers must be trained in the operation of the flashbang.
<b>Compliance mechanisms</b>	Operational use under the review of the Operation Division Lieutenant, on-duty Watch Commander or appropriate team supervisor and governed under Dinuba Police Department Policy 705-Military Equipment.
<b>Use Reporting 2023</b>	Was not used in 2023
<b>Summary of Complaints or Concerns 2023</b>	There were no complaints or concerns received.
<b>Internal Audits / Violations 2023</b>	No Violations

<b>Description</b>	An unmanned aerial vehicle

<b>Capabilities</b>	Night Vision / 30 times zoom
<b>Expected lifespan</b>	20 years
<b>Manufacturer's description</b>	Powerful aerial imaging system with class-leading agility and speed, redundant components for maximum reliability, and smart features that make performing complex tasks easy.
<b>Purpose and authorized uses</b>	To be used by trained personnel anytime an aerial view of an incident or situation would increase officer safety or public safety.
<b>Fiscal impact</b>	Zero
<b>Legal and procedural rules</b>	It is the policy of the Dinuba Police Department to utilize UAV/Drones only for official law enforcement purposes, and pursuant to State and Federal law regarding the use of UAV/Drones.
<b>Required training</b>	Prior to using a UAV/Drone, officers must be certified by FAA instructors in the operation of the UAV/Drone. Additionally, all members that operate any UAV/Drone are required to possess their FAA license.
<b>Compliance mechanisms</b>	Operational use under the review of the Operation Division Lieutenant, on-duty Watch Commander or appropriate team supervisor and governed under Dinuba Police Department Policy 606 - Unmanned Aerial Systems.
<b>Use Reporting 2023</b>	Used twice to assist in the detection and location of suspects involved in crimes.
<b>Summary of Complaints or Concerns 2023</b>	There were no complaints or concerns received.
